- 16. Medical facilities to boys and girls students separately.
- 17. Periodic meetings by IQAC to maintain and present the quality of the institution.
- 18. Participation of Faculties in designing the curriculum of the University.

OUTCOME ACHIEVED AT THE END OF ACADEMIC YEAR 2005 - 2006

- 1. Special attention was given to fulfill recommendations and the suggestions made in the NAAC Report during Academic year 2004-2005 as...
 - a. Recognition of the college under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1956. Efforts are being made to prepare for 2 (f) and submit to UGC.
 - b. Out of 26 Teachers, only 01 Teacher acquired Ph. D. and 02 acquired M. Phil degrees. Out of 26 Teachers, 23 have PG as their higher qualification. Few Teachers are enrolled for Ph. D. The college is encouraging to Faculties to register for either M. Phil or Ph. D. degrees as early as possible. Full freedom has been granted to faculties to participate in research activities. Many of the Teachers participated in the seminars /conferences / symposia to gear up the research activities.
 - c. College has only one lady faculty. College assures the appointment of more lady Teaches as and when vacancies will create.
 - d. Bridge course in English to be conducted for needy students. As it is widely acknowledged the fact that, the college is situated in rural region, the communication skills in English of the students is crucially low. The English department took efforts to arrange the bridge course in English
 - e. The college provided the indoor game facilities to Department of Physical education.
- 2. A conscious attempt is being made about the use of alternative teaching methods like the use of advanced teaching aids, discussions and group discussions, internet access during teaching, role playing, etc. in addition to power point presentations and articles presentations on PCs, Laptops, OHPs, etc. This method is adopted by Physics, Chemistry and Botany Departments in Science faculty and would be implemented in all departments in near future.

- 3. Hon'ble governing council of the college has decided to do office automation during the next academic year 2006 2007.
- 4. Attention was also given on the regular maintenance, repairing and increase of infrastructural facilities in the campus. College requests to Hon'ble governing council for such work, as the college is not receiving the development grants from UGC or any other statutory funding agency.
- 5. Study tours were organized by most of the departments from Arts and Science faculties to widen the horizons of student's knowledge.
- 6. Students are motivated to prepare for competitive examinations and to tune their careers in proper directions. Few students are appointed in military departments on various posts and few are recruited as police constables. Few students enrolled for research work and few enrolled for PG degrees.
- 7. Alumni are kept in better networking, by telephone, e-mails or by presence. Few alumni declared and provided the financial support to poor, needy and deserving students, to departments, etc. One of our alumni, Mr. Rakesh Afre, Nagoya Institute of Technology, Showaku, Japan, delivered the talk on various outstanding opportunities at abroad to students from science faculty.
- 8. The academic year 2005 was celebrated as the YEAR OF PHYSICS, after the century of the achievement by Albert Einstein (1905). At this occasion, department of Physics organized the lectures of Dr. L. A. Patil, Ms. Priti Pawar as eminent personality and alumni respectively. One of our alumni, Mr. Rakesh Afre, Nagoya Institute of Technology, Showaku, Japan, delivered the talk on various outstanding opportunities at abroad.
- 9. Faculties are encouraged by the Principal to involve in research activities, viz. to attend the International, National, State level seminars / conferences / symposia / workshops, etc. and to present the research articles in the events. This type of activity, leads the great in involving and gear up the research in the institute.
- 10. Mr. D. R. Patil, from Department of Physics, prepared and submitted his minor research to UGC and UGC (WRO, Pune) sanctioned Rs. 80,000/- to him. The first instalment of Rs. 62,000/- obtained in December 2005, and the work started.

11. Department of History organized the Two days University level workshop, on

Feb. 11 and 12, 2006. Hundreds of delegates participated the seminar.

12. Students are being encouraged by the Principal to participate in sports activities.

College conducts inter collegiate sports events, which are fully funded by college.

13. College runs the activities smoothly by appointing the faculties from Teaching

and Non Teaching Staff on various internal bodies.

14. Purchasing the furniture items viz. Benches, Stools, Tables, Chairs, Fans, etc., and

periodic purchasing of chemicals, tools, instruments and equipments, etc. as a part

of infrastructural development are being made as and when required. The

demands are put forth by the heads of the respective departments. The purchasing

committee decides and finally, Principal delivers orders against the demands.

15. Additional facilities to students such as educational tools (viz. note book, pen,

pencils, chalks, ink, files and folders, pages, chocolates, tutorial books, practical

hand books, etc), photocopies of documents and public telephone services, etc.

are being provided under one roof, which has been situated near the office.

16. Dr. Sambhajiraje R. Patil (M. D.) and Dr. Mrs. Kranti S. Patil appointed to

provide the medical facilities to boys and girl students separately. Dr. Hemant

Marathe also appointed and providing the pathological facilities to students viz.

Investgation of Hemoglobin, blood group detection, detection of Typhoid,

Malarial Parasites, widal tests, etc at a very low cost.

17. IQAC meetings are held periodically for detection and presentation of quality

enhancement by the institution.

18. Many of our faculties are engaged in participating and designing the new and

advanced curriculum in their respective field.

The college runs B. Sc. Computer Science as an unaided course, fully, for which the college has permission to take the additional fees from the students enrolled for the course. Central instrumentation workshop is situated in the department of Physics, at which few electrical and electronic devices can be repaired by the faculty at the primary level. Thus, little money can be saved by this plan.

18. Community services

Our college had provided various services to the society at our best level. The services provided are enlisted as follows:

a. NATIONAL LEPROSY ELIMINATION PROGRAM (N. L. E. P.):

Mr. D. R. Patil, (Lecturer in Physics), organized the campaign to detect the leprosy affected patients in Parola. Parola is the historical place, whose history is related to Late Rani Laxmibai, Zhansiwali. The city belongs the FORT of Rani's grandfather and the water has been stored around the FORT for the protection of FORT. The storage of water is present till today. The stored water contains the viruses of various diseases like Leprosy, Elephantiasis, etc. So, the campaign was started by Mr. D. R. Patil and his students, in collaboration with Cottage hospital, Parola. Dr. Sambhajiraje R. Patil offered the co-operation to Mr. D. R. Patil and started the search campaign in the city. Twelve cases were detected as leprosy affected persons. After the multi drugs therapy, total twelve cases were cured.

b. LOKNYAYALAYA:

Mr. D. R. Patil, (Lecturer in Physics) appointed as a member of Loknyayalaya under the supervision of Hon'ble Magistrate, judiciary court Parola. He worked to reduce the disputes which were pending in the court and cleared them. Thus the time of the court was saved to utilize it for the important work.

c. LITERACY MISSION:

Mr. D. R. Patil, (Lecturer in Physics) appointed as a member of literacy mission of Parola Tehsil region and efforts were made to appoint the Co-ordinator and co-coordinator on stipend basis. The grant was achieved from the Maharashtra Government and the stipend was given to co-ordinator and co-coordinator. Regular meetings were held with B. D. O., Parola.

d. ELEPHANTIASIS ELIMINATION PROGRAM AND OTHERS:

Mr. D. R. Patil, (Lecturer in Physics) appointed as a member of Elephantiasis elimination program for Parola Tehsil region, running under Civil Hospital Jalgaon. He worked to eliminate the disease named as elephantiasis during the period from Nov 11, 2005 to Nov 13, 2005. Many cases were found to be affected. The work was performed in collaboration of Cottage hospital Parola.

Mr. D. R. Patil took part in pulse polio campaign with his students in collaboration with the medical officer and servants in cottage hospital Parola. He is currently working for Amalner Taluka Superstition Committee, to eliminate superstitions from the society. He organized blood donation camps and made available 40 bags of blood to civil hospital, Jalgaon for emergency cases.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N. S. S.):

National Service Scheme (N. S. S.) performs the following activities with aimed to serve the society.

A set of questionnaire is circulated in the class room for the assessment of newly

appointed Teachers by the students. Students are informed to fill the questionnaire

freely. The analysis and data obtained from the questionnaire are informed to

concerned Teacher. The analysis was made by the committee constituting the Senior Faculty members and Principal. Faculties are expected to do self analyses and they are encouraged to improve the methods of Teaching and innovate.

The college established the scheme entitled "SAHAJEEVAN VIDYARTHI ARTHA SAHAYYA YOJANA". The needy, poor and deserving students can get the financial assistance (though less) from the college for their education. Funds for this scheme are raised by the faculties of Teaching and Non-Teaching staff with Principal. Total ten students got benefits by this scheme.

B. EARN WHILE YOU LEARN SCHEME:

The college runs the scheme entitled "EARN WHILE YOU LEARN", for the needy, poor and deserving students on the guide lines issued by North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon to provide the financial assistance (though less) by their contribution of work. The scheme enables the students to work at the time of education. Ten students got benefits of this scheme during this year.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

Better network has been established with the alumni by various departments. Mr. Rakesh Afre, delivered the most popular talk on the scope of Physics education and research at abroad, in front of the students of science faculty. Ms. Priti Pawar delivered the talk on research facilities available at Department of Physics, North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. Mr. Rakesh Afre and Ms. Priti Pawar, completed the B. Sc. Physics from our college. Mr. Afre is working for his research in NAGOYA INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, SHOWAKU, JAPAN. His native is Parola. He was from very poor family. Ms. Priti Pawar doing her research at Department of Physics, North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. Our department of Physics co-operated them and now they became our pride.

31. Health services:

Regular medical checkups (such as Hemoglobin detection, Blood group detection, other investigations like Malaria, Typhoid, etc.) of students are offered by Dr. Sambhajiraje R. Patil (M. D.) and Mrs. Dr. Kranti Patil to boys and girl students separately. Dr. Hemant

Marathe (Pathologist) provided the blood investigation at a very low cost basis. The medical officers are appointed for this purpose.

32. Performance in Sport activities:

College participated in inter collegiate competition. Few students are selected in University group champions in Volley ball, foot ball, weight lifting, cross country, etc.

33. Incentives to outstanding Sportsmen:

Medals, mementos, shields, certificates, track suits, prizes, etc. are being offered to outstanding sportsmen, in the form of incentives.

34. Students achievements and awards:

The topper students topped in examinations, N. S. S. awardees and Sportsmen, have been felicitated by offering the attractive gifts, prizes, certificates, trophies, mementoes, etc.

35. Activities of the guidance and counseling unit:

Career guidance cell arranged the meetings of the students in final class and provide guidance to all students. The cell organized the guest lectures of eminent personalities for the opportunities in various industrial and official fields.

Study tours are arranged for the students to acquire the applied knowledge of the subject. Other most important purpose of study tours is that, the students can acquire the knowledge to apply the innovative ideas in the industrial plant. Secondly, career guidance cell provides information to students for placement along with the individual faculty.

- 9. College authority would provide motivations to students to participate in Sports and Games.
- 10. Medical facilities would be continued to boys and girls students separately.
